Letter From the Mayor

Dear Mendham Borough residents and business owners,

2024 will be a busy year for Mendham Borough. Aside from the regular goings-on of school, sports, club meetings, and events throughout the year, we have a number of projects continuing into this new year.

Phoenix House Restoration

Work on the Phoenix House continues. The restoration crew spent quite a bit of time carefully peeling back areas of the ceiling throughout the building to get a peek at the skeleton. That look gave them the information they needed to finalize a plan to stabilize the building structure. As previously mentioned, the staff at the Phoenix House will be temporarily moved to the Bowers Building. We will keep you posted on when that actually takes place and when we believe they will move back. Stay tuned...

New OEM Co-Coordinator

Some friends leave but don't say goodbye, and some say goodbye and never leave. It is our great fortune that John Andrews is the latter. John will be continuing his dedication and service to the Borough by acting as our new Co-Coordinator of OEM. OEM stands for Office of Emergency Management. When we have any kind of emergency, like downed trees or a power outage, John will be at the helm helping to coordinate the communications between our First Responders, any needed utility company representatives, and other related parties like Morris County.

Another task John will be taking on is reestablishing our CERT members. CERT stands for Community Emergency Response Team. These are residents who volunteer to assist during an emergency. Some typical tasks a CERT member might help with are:

- Manning the cooling and warming station at the Garabrant Center
- Assisting our First Responders as needed. This could mean setting up a refreshment area for First Responders fighting a fire
- ♦ Helping to organize people in the event of a large evacuation
- ♦ Light search and rescue

Becoming a CERT member requires training, which will be coordinated by John. If you are interested in volunteering to

become a CERT member or would like additional information, please reach out to John at jandrews@mendhamnj.org.

Water Reclamation Revitalization

The rehab work will continue at our facility. The next phase of the project will be a major replacement of the electrical system. The current system was installed many decades ago. If there is one facility which cannot have a disruption to service, it is our sewer system! Have no fear, our WRF is equipped with very large generators. Fortunately for us, Brian and his team take excellent care of us and make sure we stay on top of maintenance.

Improvements to our crosswalks

Unfortunately, our society suffers from constant distractions. The worst possible time for distractions to strike is while we are driving. For this reason, we are continuously looking for ways to get drivers to pay attention to our residents and students who use our crosswalks. I speak with other Mayors regularly and discovered that some of our sister towns have reinforced their crosswalks with flags. A big thanks goes out to our Chief of Police, John Camoia, for quickly assessing my request and installing our newest defense for safer crosswalks – the red flag. Wisely, the Chief felt we should try them out first at our High School since many of our students are crossing in the evening. Directions for use of the flag is easy:

- 1. Remove flag from basket attached to crosswalk sign.
- 2. Press button to turn on the flashing sign.
- 3. Wave vigorously at the oncoming traffic.
- 4. Put the flag in the basket on the other side of the street for the next customer.

The most important step of all: use extreme caution, with or without the flag. Happy waving.

Kindergarten and 1st Grade Registration 2024-25



Hilltop School in Mendham
Borough is excited to begin the
process of forming its 2024
kindergarten class. Preregistration for the 2024-25
kindergarten class is now open.
Parents must visit our website to

review our enrollment process, pre-register, and complete the required forms to upload at the time of pre-registration. Children must be five years of age on or before October 1, 2024, in order to register for kindergarten. Any students enrolling for first grade from an outside kindergarten program should register at this time as well.

You will need your child's original birth certificate and three (3) proofs of residency from the following list: mortgage statement, certificate of occupancy, homeowner's insurance, tax bill, lease, deed, and either a gas or electric bill. You will be prompted to upload these documents in the Genesis portal during the online preregistration process.

Please visit the Hilltop School website, www.mendhamboro.org/o/hilltop-elementary-school, and click on "Student Registration" in the top right-hand corner to download the Residency Packet, Kindergarten Entrance

to download the Residency Packet, Kindergarten Entrance Form, and required medical forms including the Health Assessment Record, Universal Health Record, and Dental Exam form. Please note that the Universal Health Record will need to be completed by your child's physician and the dental form by your child's dentist. We will also require a copy of your child's up-to-date immunization records which you can obtain from your child's pediatrician. All of these forms will need to be uploaded to the Genesis Portal during the online registration process.

Mendham Borough Historic District

Office of Historic Preservation Commission

Mendham Borough has an Historic District and is documented in the National Register of Historic Places. As such, its homes contribute in a very real way to the warm, welcoming atmosphere of our Borough.

When the Borough was featured in the August 2013



edition of New Jersey Monthly, they complimented our town for having a "Main Street USA feeling," and the Historic District

unquestionably contributes to that ambience.

Commitment to the upkeep and maintenance of your home is a tribute to the spirit of Mendham and respect for our communal heritage.

In that spirit, in 2001, The Borough Council established the Historic Preservation Commission (HPC) for the protection, enhancement, and preservation of properties in the Borough with historic, cultural, and architectural character to protect the historic core of the community. This is especially true along Main Street from one side of the Borough to the other. Main Street is a major thoroughfare through town and provides a streetscape which defines Mendham Borough, not only to people passing through, but to residents as well. This is, in fact, the heart of our "historic village character."

Mendham Borough residents' continued efforts to enhance and preserve the historic character of the district are to be lauded, and their neighbors in the Borough appreciate their commitment.

Mendham Borough Department of Public Works

Tree City

Mendham Borough DPW has been hard at work keeping our



beautiful town and parks green. We have done so in collaboration with the Borough's Shade Tree Consultant, Tim Foerster.

Mendham Borough is a proud 10-year member of Tree City USA, a division of the Arbor Day Foundation. To qualify for this prestigious recognition, the Borough must meet certain benchmarks. One of the ways the Borough achieves this is by planting 20-30 new trees per year in various locations throughout the Borough.

You may have noticed tree plantings alongside Park and Mountain Avenues. This is being done due to the declining health of the existing trees. The DPW is being proactive by planting trees now. Our current plan consists of planting 24 new trees in and around Borough Park.

The species of these trees are (16) Acer Rubrum Redpointe, (2) Platanus Exclamation and (5) Acer Griseum.

We are ensuring the beautiful greenery that we are accustomed to remains. This will also provide shade and natural habitats for the wildlife in the area.
