## Letter From the Mayor

### **Borough Budget**

Now that the town budget has been submitted to the state, there are some important aspects that you should know. For the first time since the 2% cap increase was instituted in 2011, our budget will exceed the cap. This year the Governor raised the cap limit to 2.5% due to increases at the state level that have been passed down to the municipalities. Some of those increases include:

- ◆ Increased pension payments of approximately 19%
- ◆ Increased health insurance costs for our employees of approximately 22%
- ◆ New lead paint inspection requirements that municipalities have not been responsible for in the past that will require additional staffing hours

These are just a few of the new mandates handed down to us that we have had to adjust our operations and budget to accommodate. Additionally, we are faced this year with having to commit to the purchase of a new fire truck to replace a 20-year-old truck that is no longer accredited by the State of New Jersey. When a fire truck loses its accreditation, the cost of our residents' homeowner's insurance policy could increase. We closely studied the costs of refurbishing the existing pumper truck instead of purchasing a new truck, but our professionals told us that the truck is simply too old to be considered for refurbishment. Note that this fire truck is a replacement for an existing truck. It is not being acquired as a reaction to the housing applications that have recently come before the Joint Land Use Board. We would have to purchase this new truck even if these applications had not come in.

The new fire truck, along with the unanticipated mandates from the state, means we have had to increase our budget by 2.4% this year. We do not anticipate having to increase the budget again next year and are planning to come under the 2% cap. Please review the budget on our website.

### **Historic Walking Tour**

On May 6, learn more about the history of our wonderful Mendham Borough! With the Mansion in May coming to the Borough, we want to show off the most enchanting qualities of our beautiful town. Our new town Historian, Bill Maurer, has been working with some of our historically knowledgeable residents to curate three very interesting tours. The first, "Revolutionary War and Other Graves" will be at 10:30 in the old

section of Hilltop Cemetery. The 11:30 tour is "Hilltop Road – Heart of Mendham." The third tour, at 1:00pm, is called "Main Street, from East to West." More information is available on our website and the Mendham Borough Library website. We hope to see you there.

### **Mendham Borough Police Adopt New Autism Awareness Program**

Our Mendham Borough Police Department is excited to announce their participation in the "Blue Envelope" program. The "Blue Envelope" program is designed to help those affected by Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) to better communicate with law enforcement in the event of a motor vehicle stop by immediately disclosing the driver's condition to the officer in a blue envelope. The blue envelope holds the driver's documents, and communicates personal information to the officer to help facilitate smoother interactions.

The "Blue Envelope" program has been incorporated into the MBPD's Autism/Vulnerable Persons Registry (AVPR) program. If you or a family member would like a "Blue Envelope" or need more information, please contact the MBPD directly. ### **Reminder**

Thinking about installing a new fence? Remember that you need to apply for a zoning permit first. If the fence is over 6 feet tall, you will also need to get a building permit. All Zoning Permits for non-pool fences, walls, gateway & entrance pillars are issued by the Zoning Office—NOT the Construction Department. Applications require the submission of a picture of the fence and a survey indicating the placement of the fence and dimensions. All pool fence permits are issued by the Construction Department. You can find the zoning and permit applications on our website. While you're there, remember to sign up for Nixle!

The May Joint Land Use Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, May 16th at 7:30pm. It will take place in the cafeteria at Hilltop School. Please check our website for the agenda. 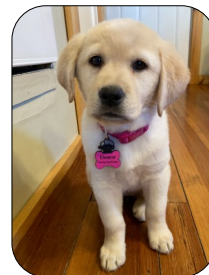

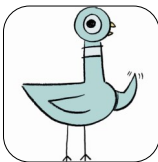
