# <u>Letter From the Mayor</u>

## Important Information About Our Sewer Project

In 2018, the Borough began the process of initiating critical improvements to the Borough Sewer Collection System and Plant. These improvements, mandated by the NJ Department of Environmental Protection, are required in order to keep our sewer system working.

The first step in a large infrastructure improvement project is to acquire the financing. In 2019 we secured a low interest loan from the NJ Infrastructure Bank for the project. This is a state bank that provides funding for infrastructure projects and makes the project more affordable by buying down half the interest of the loan. The project was estimated to cost \$5.075 million, which included upgrading the collection system, lining additional pipes, and rebuilding the entire electrical system. As a point of reference, the electrical system for the plant had last been updated in the 1960's, and in a few years we would not be able to get the parts this outdated system uses. The next phase was design, which takes time. These

projects are very complex and take a lot of time to move forward since so many different approvals are needed. Then comes the time for putting the projects out to bid — which means contractors submit their interest, plan and cost for taking on the project. It was in this process that we found out that the original cost estimates were no longer valid. The costs had gone up 22.5% for the same project. The costs went up because it will be 6 years from the start of the process to the start of construction. Some of the increases are due to inflation, escalation, supply chain cost increases, and of course the pandemic. In November, Council approved a bond issuance for an

In November, Council approved a bond issuance for an additional \$1.143 million in order to complete the project. It is extremely unfortunate that the project costs have gone up over 20%, but with such a large project and the many factors that we have all been challenged with in life over the last 5 years, it is not surprising.

What does this mean to your sewer bill? Like all our other costs, our sewer bills will be going up to cover the cost of this project. We don't know how much yet, but our Council Finance Sub-Committee will be meeting to review all aspects of this project, the financing, and our policies and procedures. As soon as they have done their due diligence, they will come back to us with their recommendation for cost increases. At that time, I will write to you again and fill you in on the result.

### **Weed and Yard Ordinance Tabled**

In October and November, the Council introduced a new Ordinance describing what is permissible yard equipment versus what constitutes junk. Additionally, the Ordinance detailed overgrowth of noxious or invasive weeds. I asked that the Ordinance be tabled because the language was not clear. Since we were so close to the end of the year and this Ordinance would require two meetings in the same calendar year, this item is on hold until the second meeting of January. Stay tuned to our website for more information.

### **Land Use Schedule**

The next Joint Land Use meeting will be held Tuesday, December 19th. As of the writing of this newsletter, no information was available regarding items for the agenda.
