It's sad for me to have to write this important paragraph. This past summer our Junior Girl Scout Troop spent months raising money and then finally installing, with assistance from the Mayor and some Council members, two tetherball stations. Before the end of summer, both stations had been vandalized with the balls and strings being stolen and poles being damaged. After discussion with Jeff in DPW, the town decided to purchase new strings and balls and get the two stations back for play for our residents for this summer season. It took only one day for the ball to be cut away from one of the stations again. I have told Jeff not to replace it. If the other ball is stolen, then that will conclude our tetherball service for this season.

Over the last few years, a few pieces of Borough property have been vandalized. Every time this occurs, the town fixes or replaces the damaged equipment. I firmly believe that Mendham can do better than this. Please speak with your family members and remind everyone that vandalism costs money and takes time away from other jobs our team takes care of. We want to plan for more recreational facilities in town. Knowing that we have residents who take pride in and have respect for our facilities will make it more sensible for us to make those investments in our community.

The Mendham Borough Library is a vibrant part of the Mendham Community and is flourishing. Last year we had a dramatic increase of over 35% in both program attendance (over 8,000) and library visits (almost 47,000). Our library is a community center, with so much more than just books. We have offerings for individuals of all ages: yoga, kids' crafts and programs, bridge, canasta, and free online digital services too. Our library is funded in part by the town, but the amount is at its discretion and covers only a portion of our budget. As an association library, we rely on friends and neighbors' donations to help us meet our annual budgetary needs so we can continue to provide resources for all to enjoy.

This past year, we have worked hard to bring more to our community. We added a new monthly program for teens, a knitting group, special monthly adult programs, an early literacy class for babies, and digital learning devices that patrons can check out (Kindles pre-loaded with best-sellers for adults and Read-Aloud books and learning tablets for kids).

Currently, we are excited to share that we are planning an outdoor learning space for our entire community. Our plans include a sitting area with tables and chairs for small group gatherings and a larger program space with a sitting wall for special events. We are delighted to continue to expand our services for the residents of Mendham.

We are incredibly proud of the great work the Library does. We hope you appreciate the importance of the Library to the community and ask that you show your support with a contribution. The Arbor Day Foundation has once again named Mendham Borough as a 2022 Tree City USA member.

Mendham Borough has met and exceeded the requirements each year, planting and replacing trees to keep our community beautiful and tree lined. In addition to the aesthetics of planting trees, the trees positively impact the air quality and provide a natural habitat for many species.



This award is issued by the partnership of the Arbor Day Foundation and the U.S. Forest Service that was founded in 1976. We are proud to say that Mendham Borough has received this honor for the past 10 years!

Last year, Mendham Borough Public Works planted over 35 new trees in the Borough.

A Message from the Mendham Borough Fire Marshal



Summer is almost upon us! Here are some tips for keeping it fire-safe.

Make sure your gas grill is working properly. Leaks or breaks are

primarily a problem with gas grills. Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year.

Never leave equipment unattended. For campfires, fire pits, and chimineas, always have a hose, bucket of water, or shovel and dirt or sand nearby, and make sure the fire is completely out before going to sleep or leaving the area.

Keep equipment a safe distance from things that can burn. Place your grill well away (at least 3 feet)

from anything that can burn, including deck railings and overhanging branches. Also, keep them out from under eaves.

Use fuel and fire starters properly. If you use a starter fluid to ignite charcoals, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never use gasoline or other flammable or combustible liquids on firepits, chimineas, or campfires.

If a fire breaks out, call 911! For any type of outdoor fire that can't be quickly and effectively extinguished, call the fire department immediately for assistance.

Phoenix House Under Construction

The Phoenix House restoration project is on track to begin this month. The project will be a peek into the past as they peel back the layers and dismantle parts of the interior to get to the structural areas for repair. The project is being completed with both Morris County and State historic trust fund dollars. The project manager cannot predict exactly how long the work will take, depending on what they find behind the walls. The building will remain open and staff will be in their regular offices for now.
